### **Delamere Forest News**

We meet up with Forestry England every six months to discuss any issues that affect equestrian users and had a meeting last month. There's a new trail coming to the Whitefield area of the forest, which was part of the planning conditions attached to the Forest Holidays development. The trail will include a range of wellbeing, fitness and play with timber equipment set in a natural surface and some signage and seating. Civils works will begin on the trail surface soon and we'll post something on our Facebook page as it may be advisable to avoid riding through this area while works are ongoing. We have been consulted and the proposed locations appear acceptable and the equipment will be set well back off the paths. There will be quite a bit of vegetation clearance as a lot of the paths are becoming overgrown with some tree cutting where overhanging and this will improve access for riders. If you find any trees down or low branches obstructing routes, the best thing is to report these to delamere@forestryengland.uk with a photo and what3words location. The policy is to keep the main routes clear but the minor routes are not priority. We have also been encouraged to report any anti-social behaviour such as dog issues or electric bikes to both Forestry England and the Police via their website or by ringing 101. We would also recommend that riders report any incidents to the BHS too via the Horse i app.

As well as horses we saw some other rare breeds including red deer, polecats and wild cats and we finished off the evening with tea and cake in the Lakeside cafe. If you haven't been before it's well worth a visit and it's open all year round.




# **Whitegate Way**

We have met with representatives from Cheshire West and Cheshire Council recently and now have permission to install a timber mounting block similar to those in Delamere Forest. We will need to secure the funding and the Council will carry out the surfacing works first. This should be well used as most riders appear to use the picnic tables at the moment. We are also trying to get some better signage for the area designated for horse box parking.

#### FRODSHAM MARSHES - PROPOSED SOLAR DEVELOPMENT

A large solar farm is proposed on Frodsham Marshes and an indicative layout is shown below. We have been asked about the number of equestrians who ride or carriage drive in this area and any suggestions for improvements. If you ever ride here or know anyone who does please let us know. We know that some riders are discouraged by having to cross the A56 and M56 and riding past the wind turbines. We have suggested some horse box parking and some surface improvements to the restricted byways and if you have any other comments please get in touch.



### Incorporation

As reported at the AGM earlier this year, the committee are still considering establishing MCBA as a Charitable Incorporated Organisation (CIO). As a CIO, MCBA would become a legal entity in its own right, thereby minimising the liability of its volunteer committee members. This status will bring with it changes to the format of our constitution but not our aims and will require us to report on an annual basis to the Charity Commission.
