

Frodsham Restricted Byway 45

Please let us know if you hear that as issue has been resolved so we can post on our Facebook pages so others are aware. The permissive route between the Whitegate Way and the Oakmere Way has been blocked again recently by a falling tree and has now been cleared by Forestry England, as part of the adjacent Lobslack Nursery.
